

The 16 to 19 Tuition Fund 2021 to 2022 Academic Year

Introduction

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is a one-off allocation being provided to 16 to 19 institutions to help mitigate the disruption to learning arising from COVID-19. The funding is to be used to support small group tuition where students have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/ or Mathematics.

How the funding will be used

It is anticipated NSfG will receive £12,279 this academic year which will be used to facilitate small group tuition of no more than 7 pupils. This funding will be targeted at students who have not received a grade 4 or 5 in English and/ or mathematics as a priority, students who are from an economically disadvantaged background as well as students on a level 2 pathway.

Tuition will be in addition to the student's normal programme of study and delivered by the schools dedicated members of staff. Tuition will take place on-site either during the school day, after school, on Saturday mornings or during the school holidays.

Accountability

NSfG intends to use all of the funds during 2021/22 academic year and will keep records to show the individuals who benefit from the funding and will retain evidence of the total number of hours delivered as well as total the cost. This information will be recorded in the school census'. If the funds aren't spent in full during the academic year, the Education Skills and Funding Agency will be notified for this to be reclaimed.
